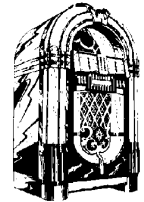
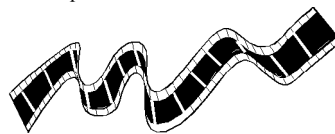
Vice-President John N. Garner noted that while ten pounds of potatoes had risen to twenty-four cents, he said that the American public had, in 1940, more buying power than ever before.
